CTS Datasets

The micro file contains 4 datasets, each one to be used to produce specific types of travel statistics. Following are the names and main uses of each dataset.

1. Person dataset

- Used for statistics related to travellers.
- Name - ECTD.STATCAN.CTSyymmm.MICRO.PERSON
(yy = year; mm = month of survey).

2. Person-trip/Hhld-trip dataset

- Used for trip-related statistics.
- Name - ECTD.STATCAN.CTSyymmm.MICRO.PTRIP

3. Person-night dataset

- Used for statistics related to nights spent away from home.
- Name - ECTD.STATCAN.CTSyymmm.MICRO.PNIGHT

4. Reallocated Expenditures dataset

- Used for expenditure statistics by type and location where money was spent.
- Name - ECTD.STATCAN.CTSyymmm.MICRO.REALEXP

Record Layout

Note: From position 001 to 206, 1988 data fields occupy the same positions as in 1986.

Most of the variables on each of the 4 datasets are common, therefore the accompanying record layout contains both a section of these common variables, plus sections for additional variables in each specific dataset. These are the differences between the 4 datasets:

1. Person dataset (traveller statistics)

- . One record per survey respondent.
- . Each record contains:
 - traveller and non-traveller demographics;
 - information on all trips taken in the quarter.
- . Field 15 (person weight):
 - this weighting factor is used to produce estimates on traveller statistics;
 - the position and field size of the person weight are: (28-36) and 9, (9(5)V9(4)).

2. Person-trip/Hhld-trip dataset

- . One record per unique trip taken. If identical trips were taken during the quarter, then this was built into the weighting factors.
- . Field 15 (person-trip weight):
 - this weighting factor is used to produce travel volume estimates in person-trips;
 - **do not** use this weight for expenditure estimates;
 - the position and field size of the person-trip weight are: (28-37) and 10, (9(6)V9(4)).

- . Field 16 (hhld-trip weight), referred to as "trip weight" on the file:
 - this weighting factor is used to produce hhld-trip characteristic, including reported expenditures estimates;
 - the position and field size of the trip weight are: (38-47) and 10, (9(6)V9(4)).
- . **Note.** This dataset can also be used to produce person-night statistics. Multiply the person-trip weight (field 15) by the "nights spent" fields (45, 46 and 47).

3. Person-night dataset

- . One record per overnight trip.
- . Identical variables to the person-trip/hhld-trip dataset, except for field 15.
- . Field 15 (person-night weight):
 - use this weight to produce estimates of person-nights spent away from home;
 - see **NOTE** under "Person-trip/Hhld-trip dataset" above;
 - the position and field size of the person-night weight are: (28-38) and 11, (9(7)V9(4)).

4. Reallocated Expenditures dataset

- . One record per trip where household members had expenditures.
- . To create this dataset, reported expenditures (those obtained on the questionnaire) were reallocated in two ways:
 - to location where the money was spent (16 codes), and
 - to type of expenditures (8 types).
 Thus, there are 128 ($8 * 16$) expenditure variables added to this dataset.
- . Field 16 (trip weight, or hhld-trip weight):
 - use this weight to produce expenditure statistics;
 - the position and field size of the trip (or hhld-trip) weight are: (38-47) and 10, (9(6)V9(4)).
