Introduction

NOTE:

During the actual interview the questions were personalized to be appropriate to the gender of the respondent.

The questions were asked in present tense if asking about current job or current activity; past tense if asking about former job or former activity.

Many universe statements have no prefix attached to the referred questions. Example: CED_QA1 is referred as A1.

Throughout this document, the term "During the last 12 months" refers to the 12 months prior to the interview. For example: if the interview takes place in February 2003, then the STARTMONTH would be from February 2002 to January 2003

Blanks not allowed, they are changed to 9, the questions are being skipped then blanks are changed to 6, 96, 996, 9996, etc.

All variables are defined Numeric, unless otherwise stated.

NOTE:

Record Layout Conventions: The record layout has been separated into five sections:

The first section deals with Administrative information, i.e. basic survey information like province, language identifiers, age, sex, outcome codes, etc; the second deals with the Geographic information; the third section deals with Background Questionnaire Information. This section is divided into 9 parts: Education & Citizenship, Linguistic Information, Parental Information, Labour Force Information, Literacy and Numeracy, Education and Learning, Numeracy Practices, Information and communication technology literacy (ICTL), and Household Information. The fourth section deals with the Weights and the fifth section deals with Literacy Measures. The derived variables are located in their respective sections.
