Notes on Interpretation of the Record Layout

The following interpretative notes refer to fields of the record layout, successively for the University and College Programs file and for the Trade-vocational Programs file. They should be used in conjunction with the record layouts given in Appendix F of this report.

142-144 Combined field of study.

The codes used are USIS "SPEMAJ" codes for university graduates or corresponding CCSIS codes for college graduates. Where only 1 or 2 graduates were found in a specific program and the program was offered in less than 3 institutions in that region (position 1), the graduates were recoded to the program code "not elsewhere classified" or "other" of the sub-classification. For example, if only 2 college graduates in New Brunswick were found in Handicrafts (code 213) and it was established that the program was only offered in 1 or 2 institutions in the Atlantic region, the 2 graduates were recoded to "Other Fine Arts", code 214.

157-160 Occupation (SOC) May to June 1984.

The 1980 Standard Occupational Classification codes were used. Where only 1 or 2 graduates in a region were found in a specific occupation, the graduates were recoded to the "not welsewhere classified" sub-classification. For example, if only 2 graduates were found as Government Administrators (code 1111) in the Atlantic Region, they were recoded to code 1119, Officials and Administrators, n.e.c.

183-184 Derived variable "DIST" has been computed as a "straight" line distance (more correctly, great-circle distance using latitude-longitude coordinated between the centroids of the Forward Sortation Area (FSA) of the postcode for the institution from which the respondent graduated in 1982, and the FSA for the respondent's home postcode in June 1984 (from Q. 106). The FSA is the area covered by the first three digits of the postcode. For many middle-sized cities with more than one FSA, distances between FSAs were ignored and read as zero. For the Universite du Quebec and New Brunswick Community Colleges, it was not possible to identify the campus the graduates attended;; thus, no distance measurement is shown for graduates of these institutions. Some other institutions also have a main campus and satellite campuses, where it was not possible to determine which campus a graduate had attended; it was judged that the effect of using the FSA for the main campus would not introduced too much distortion. Other "unknown" responses stem from no, or incomplete, response to Q. 106.
