FOOTNOTES

- (a) Unless otherwise noted, all fees and costs are for two semesters (8 months) or 30 credits.
- (b) The data have not been adjusted to reflect a regular academic year of 8 months because of the different nature of graduate studies, which also includes a research component (program basis may be 12 months).
- (c) Pre-Agriculture/Pre-Architecture/Pre-Dentistry/Pre-Engineering/Pre-Law/Pre-Medicine.
- (d) Special fees are charged for internship students.
- (e) Estimated figure.
- (f) This institution offers a veterinary medicine program (DMV). Fees are generally higher for this program than fees charged for other science programs.
- (g) For the first year, then a lesser fee is charged for each subsequent year of the program.
- (h) Additional fees are charged for specific courses, which may vary with the faculty offering the course, for course materials, or for student societies that are specific to a particular faculty.
- (i) The University of Winnipeg offers graduate programs jointly with the University of Manitoba, the latter handles registration and fees.
- (j) The Technical University of Nova Scotia amalgamated with Dalhousie University in 1998. Dalhousie will handle registration and fees.
- (k) Special fees are charged for co-op students on work terms for which credit hours are granted.
- (l) Beginning in 1997-98, the universities of Quebec have adopted a new fee structure for Canadian students. Fees are lower for residents of Quebec than they are for out-of-province students.
- (m) Tuition for specialized or Executive MBA programs may be superior to those charged for most graduate programs.
- (n) Students enrolled in this program may register for more than 30 credits per academic year.

- (o) For the first two years of the program. A lesser fee is charged for each subsequent year.
- (p) Data have been adjusted to reflect 30 credits with the exceptions of law, dentistry and medicine which usually have set fees based on an 8 month academic year.
- (q) Data are based on a 30 credit, eight-month academic year except for the law program, which is based on an eight-month academic year of 29 to 32 credits depending on the year of study.
- (r) Tuition fees for graduate programs vary a great deal depending on the course registration. The figure provided is for 18 units of course weight per year.
- (s) Royal Roads University offers programs, which require undergraduate students to compress the last two years of their degree into one full (12 month) year, and graduate students to stay on campus only 5 weeks out of the year.
- (t) Under a special pilot program, undertaken through an agreement between the Government of Newfoundland and the governments of Malaysia and the United States, 20 foreign students will pay \$30,000 per year.
- (u) As a result of agreements between the Government of Quebec and other countries such as France, citizens of these countries may be exempted from paying the usual foreign tuition fees, paying instead the same fee as students from Quebec.
- (v) No foreign students are accepted for the program.
- (w) A special health service fee may be charged to foreign students.
- (x) Health services included in athletics.
- (y) Students may opt out of the health care plan.
- (z) Athletic and health service fees are included in tuition fees.
- (aa) Coop students pay higher health insurance fees.
- (bb) Accommodation costs are for university-operated residences and housing. Not included are accommodations in off-campus private quarters; transportation; and personal expenditures for books, entertainment, etc clothing.
- (cc) Married student accommodation is geared to income and size of family.
- (dd) Includes mandatory residence association fee.
