Subject: Typographical modifications in the descriptions for Work Stress (WST) Derived Variables and change in Derived Variable code for WSTDJST.

Product(s) affected: Master and share files (released September 18th 2013) and public use microdata file (released April 3rd 2014)

Year(s) affected: 2012

Description of the problem(s):

After the release of the data file in September 2013, the following typographical revisions were made to some Derived Variable descriptions.

Most changes only affect the variable descriptions and therefore the data are not impacted. However, the derived variable WSTDJST had an error in the specifications which also resulted in the variable being calculated incorrectly. Data users who are working with the WSTDJST variable are instructed to use the code provided in this Errata to correct the variable.

WSTDJST	E, F	Revised description - Description should be changed to: "This variable indicates whether the respondent experienced job strain at their main work in the past 12 months. Job strain is measured as a ratio of psychological demands to decision latitude which includes skill discretion (skill attitudes) and decision authority. 1. Higher scores indicate greater job strain. 2. Higher scores indicate greater work stress. 3. Scores are inversed here for questions WST_Q401, WST_Q402, WST_Q403, WST_Q409 (decision latitude questions) for use in the denominator. Since WST_Q404 had been inversed for the calculation of WSTDSKI, it is inversed again before calculating WSTDJST. 4. At the beginning of this section, scores were inversed in the temporary reformat for question WST_Q405. The inversed WST_Q405 is used here (as in WTSDPSY)." New note for the specifications of the DV (see step 3 on next page): "All items have +1 added to them so that the denominator will not be 0 under any combination of answers." Subject: Minor typographical errors in data dictionaries, labels and formats

Product(s) affected: Master and share files (released September 18th 2013) and public use microdata file (released April 3rd 2014)

Year(s) affected: 2012

Description of the problem(s):

After the release of the Public Use Microdata file (PUMF) in April 2014, the following minor typographical errors in the CCHS – Mental Health master, share and PUMF data dictionary, labels and format files were detected. Revised versions of the labels and formats have been created for all three file types. In addition, the data dictionary has been re-created for the PUMF. Note: All of the errors concern the metadata. No errors have been found in the data. The following corrections have been made.
