**Microdata Documentation and  
Users Guide**



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## 1. INTRODUCTION

The National Alcohol and Drug Survey was a telephone survey conducted across Canada in March 1989. Interviews were conducted from eight centralized facilities across the country. Interviews were conducted in all 10 provinces. The survey was conducted by Statistics Canada for the Health Studies Unit of Health and Welfare. The survey design, sampling, data collection and data processing were the responsibility of Statistics Canada who worked closely with representatives from Health and Welfare.

The purpose of this package is to provide users with documentation which will enable them to access and manipulate the microdata file for the National Alcohol and Drug Survey (NADS). It contains details on the survey methodology, data processing and weighting procedures as well as guidelines for releasing estimates based on the survey results.

The file layout and technical specifications on the tape are included in the appendix.

## 2. OBJECTIVES

The survey objectives, as outlined by Health and Welfare were to:

- 1) facilitate planning of prevention initiatives (set target groups, identify issues, determine receptivity to programs);
- 2) assess people's willingness to respond to alcohol and other drug issues;
- 3) estimate the magnitude of alcohol and other drug related problems;
- 4) provide baseline information for long-range evaluation of the changes in alcohol and other drug experiences of Canadians;
- 5) document, describe and analyze the alcohol and other drug experiences of Canadians from all provinces with regard to use patterns, complications associated with use, risk-related behaviours, self-care, and treatment and attitudes about the subject.

### 3. POPULATION

The target population for the National Alcohol and Drug Survey was all persons 15 years of age and over living in Canada, with two exclusions. We did not attempt to cover residents of the Yukon and Northwest Territories or full-time residents of institutions. The territories were excluded due to the significant percentage of the population without telephones, particularly outside the major communities. Residents of institutions such as prisons or hospitals were excluded due to the fact that their situation differs markedly from that of the general population. Furthermore, it would have been extremely difficult to conduct interviews with the residents. This is a typical exclusion for this type of survey.

The sampling method employed in the NADS was random digit dialling (RDD). As a result, households without telephones were not covered by the sampling frame. Approximately 2% of households in Canada do not have telephones and their characteristics differ some what from the general population. Data collected in 1984 indicate that persons in these households tend to be young, male, single and less educated than the general population.

The small number of non-telephone households means that their exclusion will not result in a major bias in the data collected by most surveys. Table A compares estimates of selected demographic variables from the March 1989 Canadian Labour Force Survey (LFS), controlling for telephone ownership of the household. The estimates for the total population and the telephone population are almost imperceptibly different, although it is obvious that non-telephone households are different. The exclusion of this group from the NADS should, however, be kept in mind when small sub-groups of the population, with characteristics similar to the non-telephone group, are being analyzed. For example, if young, single, non-working males are being analyzed, the percentage not represented will have a greater impact on results. However, the estimates from the National Alcohol and Drug Survey have been adjusted (weighted) to include persons without telephones.

#### 4. SURVEY DESIGN

The Alcohol and Drug Survey employed two different Random Digit Dialling sampling techniques.

For Newfoundland, Nova Scotia, Ontario and Alberta, the Elimination of Non-Working Banks methods was used. A description of this procedure is given in Section 4.2. For the remaining provinces the Waksberg method was used. This procedure is described in Section 4.1.

##### 4.1. Telephone Sample (Waksberg Design) (P.E.I., N.B., Que., Man., Sask., B.C.)

The Waksberg Method is a Random Digit Dialling sampling technique which significantly reduces the cost of a survey as compared to dialling telephone numbers completely at random. The method employs a two-stage design which increases the likelihood of contacting households. The following describes what was done for the Alcohol and Drug Survey in the above-mentioned provinces.

First, each of the six provinces was divided into strata - one stratum representing the Census Metropolitan Areas (CMA's) of the province, the other representing the non-CMA areas. Montreal formed a third stratum in the province of Quebec. An up-to-date list of all telephone area code and existing prefix number combinations was obtained for each stratum. To these, all possible combinations of the next two digits were added to form banks of telephone numbers (e.g. 613-224-01, 613-224-02, etc.). These banks formed the primary sampling units (PSU's).

Within each stratum, a random selection of banks was made. For each selected bank the final two digits were generated at random. The number was then called to determine whether or not it reached a household. If it did not reach a household (i.e., the telephone number was not assigned for use or was a business, institution, etc.), the PSU was dropped from further consideration. If the telephone number did reach a household, the PSU was retained and additional numbers (referred to as secondary numbers) were generated within the same bank. These numbers were also called to determine whether or not they reached a household.

Secondary numbers were generated on a continuing basis until (i) five additional households were reached in each retained bank or (ii) the bank was exhausted or (iii) the survey period ended.

Primary numbers were generated continuously throughout the survey period in order to yield a predetermined required number of households within each stratum. The probability of selection at the first stage is proportional to the number of working household numbers in the PSU. At the second stage, the probability of selection is inversely proportional to the number of working household numbers in the series. The design therefore yields an equal probability sample of household numbers.

This method is more efficient than "pure" random digit dialling because there is a higher probability of reaching a household if the telephone number for that household is within a bank that contains at least one other household. For the Alcohol and Drug Survey, in the provinces in which the Waksberg method was used, about 56.1% of the secondary numbers called reached a household, while only 15.0% of the primary numbers called reached a household. The overall hit rate for this method was 38.1%.

#### 4.2. Telephone Sample (Elimination of Non-Working Banks Design) (NFLD, NS, ONT, ALTA)

The Elimination of Non-Working Banks (ENWB) design is a form of Random Digit Dialling in which all working banks (i.e., all banks that have within them at least one household) for an area are identified prior to sampling. This method is more efficient than Waksberg since all telephone numbers within non-working banks are already eliminated from the sampling frame. This is the method that was used to sample the 15+ age group in Newfoundland, Nova Scotia, Ontario and Alberta. Again, strata were formed within each of the two provinces representing CMA and non-CMA portions. Toronto formed a third stratum in the province of Ontario.

Using information obtained from the telephone companies, a list of working banks was compiled. A systematic sample of banks was then selected within each stratum, and for each selected bank the final two digits of the telephone number were generated at random. The proportion of numbers called which reached a household was 50.8% with the ENWB method.

#### 4.3 Selection of Respondents

The final stage of sampling was at the household level. After determining household membership from the person answering the telephone, the interviewers randomly selected one respondent from the members 15 years of age and older. The members were listed in order from oldest to youngest and each questionnaire was affixed with a label that indicated which person to select, based on the number of household members 15 years or older. Surveys that do not randomly select tend to have an over-representation of the types of individuals which are easy to reach.

## 5. DATA COLLECTION

Telephone interviewing was chosen as the interviewing method for this survey because it satisfied several important issues; anonymity of respondents was felt to be important because of the sensitive questions asked; as well, due to the nature of the questions, proxy reporting would not be acceptable. Also, telephone interviewing ensures cost-effective, high quality data with a reasonable response rate.

Interviewing for this survey was conducted from centralized telephone interviewing locations in Statistics Canada's eight regional offices. The interviews were conducted between the hours of 8:30 am and 9:30 pm March 1, 1989 to March 25, 1989. Prior to the start of the survey, interviewers were trained for two days on interviewing techniques as well as concepts unique to the NADS.

Refusals at either the household level or at the selected respondent level were called back by a senior interviewer in order to try to elicit cooperation on the part of the respondents.

## 6. SAMPLE AND RESPONSE

### 6.1 Sample Size

Good national estimates from the survey data are needed for use by the federal government and national associations; as well, statistically reliable estimates are needed at the provincial level since policy and program initiatives will likely be done by the provinces. To fulfil the national requirements a sample allocation proportional to provincial population is optimal. To fulfill the provincial requirement, an equal allocation of sample is optimal. The sample allocation chosen was as follows: (1) proportional to the square root of the provincial population; (2) if the sample size from (1) was less than 1,000, the sample was boosted to 1,000.

The square root design was chosen to lessen the effect of the vast differences in size between the largest provinces and the smallest provinces when calculating the proportions.

### 6.2 Methodology

Several factors governed the choice of methodology for the National Alcohol and Drug Survey: (1) anonymity of respondents, (2) cost, (3) non-proxy reporting, and (4) ability to accurately select and refer to a respondent without using names. It was felt that allowing respondents to remain anonymous would increase response rates and increase the likelihood that they would report truthfully to sensitive questions. Cost of course was to be kept as low as possible. Non-proxy reporting was desirable since many of the questions concerned attitudes and knowledge. It was important to have the interviews conducted in such a way as to allow the interviewer to accurately determine the number of eligible persons in the household, select a respondent, and unambiguously refer to that respondent without giving the impression that his/her identity was known to the interviewer. The Random Digit Dialling telephone methodology was chosen since it satisfied these factors.

Telephone numbers in the sample were first screened to determine if they belonged to a household, a business or were non-working. Household phone numbers were considered "screened-in" for the survey. The person answering the phone was asked to give the ages of all household members. These ages were listed in order from oldest to youngest. The interviewers randomly selected a respondent from those household members aged 15 and over. The selection was done according to a selection grid printed on a label on each questionnaire. The interviewer used only age (and occasionally birth date) to refer to the respondent; names were never asked and were not recorded, even if volunteered by the respondent. This random selection ensured that the sample was not over-represented by types of individuals which are easy to reach (i.e. housewives). No substitutions were allowed and no proxy interviews were accepted.

### 6.3 Response Rates

Table B summarizes the number of telephone numbers called, households screened in, responding households and responding selected persons for the National Alcohol and Drug Survey. The overall hit rate for the survey was 43%; the overall response rate for the survey was 78.7%. Reasons for non-response are: refusal, illness, injury, absence for the duration of the survey, language problems, and no contact.

### 6.4 Evaluation of the Sample

The sample for the NAD survey was randomly selected. However, because of the different sampling rates used (province by stratum), the different hit rates for the ENWB and Waksberg approaches to RDD sampling, and response rates, the unweighted estimates will not be representative of the population. Table C compares the age-sex distribution of respondents to the age-sex distribution of the total population. In general, the 15-24 age group tends to be under-represented and the 25-44 age group tends to be over-represented in the sample. The 45+ age group is under-represented in the sample, with the exception of females 65+ who are over-represented.

As mentioned in section 3, telephone coverage is not the same within all age-sex groups, therefore again unweighted sample counts are not representative of the survey's target population.

The weight assigned to each sample record takes into account the sampling rate and survey non-response. The weights are adjusted so that weighted counts will represent the overall population by age and sex in each province. However, other characteristics have not been adjusted for in the weighting. The NAD survey can therefore be evaluated on how survey estimates of such characteristics compare with external estimates. Since no exact Census counts are available for March 1989, a comparison has been made with the Labour Force Survey (the largest monthly household survey) for March 1989, comparing marital status and occupation of workers (see Table D).

The NADS sample obtained comparable results to the LFS in terms of marital status. The occupation distribution for NADS does not correspond as well to the LFS distribution. One source of differences is the higher number of "not stated" responses in NADS. Another source of differences is the reference period - in NADS, occupation was reported for the previous 12 months regardless of whether the person was currently employed or unemployed; in LFS, occupation was reported for the job held in the reference week for employed persons, and occupation of the last job for unemployed persons.

## 7. DATA PROCESSING

Upon completion of the interviewing phase of the survey, the information was data captured on mini-computers in the regional offices and electronically transmitted to Statistics Canada's head office in Ottawa for further processing. All survey records were subjected to an exhaustive computer edit to identify and correct invalid or missing data. Records with missing or incorrect data were assigned a "not stated" code or corrected from other information on that respondent's questionnaire. The only fields that were not allowed to become "not stated" were those that were required for weighting. For number of telephones in the household, a value of one was assigned automatically if missing; the variables age, sex and household size were imputed randomly. After the editing phase was complete a rather large set of variables were derived from others in order to create a more "user friendly" data tape. These derived variables were created at the request of the sponsor.

Since the National Alcohol and Drug Survey was based on a sample of households, each responding household and person represented a number of other households and persons. The final stage of processing was the calculation of a weight for each record. This procedure is explained in detail in the next section.

## 8. WEIGHTING AND ESTIMATION

### 8.1 Why are Weights Necessary?

Because of differences in the sampling rates (within a province and stratum) and differences in hit rates and response rates, the unweighted sample counts are not representative of the survey's target population. In order to account for these differences and make the sample representative of the population a weight is assigned to each survey record. Weights must be used in all tabulations if the results are to be meaningful.

### 8.2 Calculation of Weights

Seven steps were used to calculate the final weight: (1) assign basic weight, (2) household non-response adjustment, (3) multiple telephone adjustment, (4) person weight calculation, (5) selected person non-response adjustment, (6) adjustment to external stratum population estimates, and (7) adjustment to external province-sex-age group estimates. The following sections describe these steps in detail.

#### 8.2.1 Basic Weight

A self-weighting stratified sample design is one for which each unit in the same stratum has the same basic weight. For a two-stage sample design, this happens if the Primary Sampling Unit (PSU) is selected with probability proportional to its size, and secondary sampling units are selected with equal probability. This means that overall all units in a stratum should have the same probability of being selected, and the basic weight should be (# units in stratum)/(# units in sample).

For the National Alcohol and Drug Survey, the PSU's were banks of telephone numbers and secondary sampling units were actual telephone numbers corresponding to households within those banks. The basic weight for all phone numbers identified as households should be (# hhlds in survey)/(# hhlds in stratum). Since two different sampling techniques (Waksberg, ENWB) were used for this survey, different methods of deriving the basic weight were employed.

For the Waksberg design, the probability of a given household being selected is  $\frac{1}{\text{# hhlds in bank}} \times \frac{\text{# hhlds in bank}}{\text{# hhlds in stratum}}$ .

Although these probabilities apply when the sample is selected, the actual values of the probabilities are unknown. That is, we do not know how many households are in a given bank or how many households are in the entire stratum. The approach that is taken therefore is to assign all sample units identified as households a basic weight of 1.0 (regardless of whether or not they responded). All households in the stratum have the same basic weight (as they should with an equal probability sample), but the weight does not yet indicate how many households in the population are represented by a surveyed household; this will not occur until adjustments are made to external population counts.

For the ENWB design, the probability of a given telephone number being selected is  $\frac{1}{\# \text{ working banks in stratum}} \times \frac{1}{100}$ .

Therefore the basic weight for each telephone number sampled in the stratum is  $100 \times \# \text{ working banks in stratum} / \# \text{ phone numbers sampled in stratum}$  (regardless of whether or not the number reached a household, and whether or not there was a response). All telephone numbers in the stratum have the same basic weight; the basic weight indicates how many telephone numbers in the stratum are represented by each telephone number in the sample in that stratum. Assuming that the proportion of households reached (hit rate) is the same in the sample as it is in the population, the basic weight of households indicates the number of household telephone numbers each one represents.

#### 8.2.2 Household Non-Response Adjustment

For the Waksberg design, weights for responding households were adjusted to represent non-responding households. Within each selected working bank, the sampling scheme required that 6 households be contacted. In some cases, one or more of these households did not respond to the survey. Weights of responding households were adjusted to compensate for non-responding households in the same bank. The basic weights of responding households were adjusted by the following ratio:

$$\frac{6}{\# \text{ resp. hhlds in bank}}$$

For the ENWB design, weights for responding households were adjusted to represent non-responding households. This was done independently within each areacode-prefix (ACP). Basic weights were adjusted by the factor:

$$\frac{\text{sum of basic weights of hhlds in ACP}}{\text{sum of basic weights of responding hhlds in ACP}}$$

In both cases, non-responding households were dropped after the non-response adjustment was made.

#### 8.2.3 Multiple Telephone Adjustment

Households with more than one private telephone number have a higher probability of being selected. The weights for such households were adjusted downwards by dividing by the number of telephone numbers that serviced the household (as determined in the interview).

#### 8.2.4 Person Weight Calculation

A person weight was calculated for each selected person by multiplying the household weight by the number of eligible persons (age 15+) in the household.

#### 8.2.5 Selected Person Non-Response Adjustment

Weights for responding selected persons were adjusted to represent non-responding selected persons. For the Waksberg design, the adjustment was done at the bank level by multiplying the person weight of responding selected persons by the following factor:

$$\frac{\text{sum of person weights of persons in bank}}{\text{sum of person weights of responding persons in bank}}$$

For the ENWB design, the adjustment was done at the areacode-prefix (ACP) level by multiplying the person weight of responding selected persons by the following factor:

$$\frac{\text{sum of person weights of persons in ACP}}{\text{sum of person weights of responding persons in ACP}}$$

In both cases, non-responding selected persons were then dropped.

Note: In some cases respondents only completed part of the survey questionnaire; after analysis of this partial data, it was decided that these people would be dropped from the final data file. Therefore, in the weighting, they were treated as selected person non-respondents.

#### 8.2.6 Adjustment to Stratum Population Totals

An adjustment was made to the person weights in order to make the population totals consistent with Census projected population counts at the stratum level. This was done by multiplying the person weight for each record within the stratum by the following ratio:

$$\frac{\text{Census population projection for the stratum}}{\text{sum of person weights of NADS respondents in the stratum}}$$

#### 8.2.7 Province-Sex-Age Adjustment

The final weighting step was to ratio-adjust the weights to agree with Census projected population counts at the province-sex-age group (PSA) level. The seven age groupings used were: 15-19, 20-24, 25-34, 35-44, 45-54, 55-64, 65+.

Within each of the 140 PSA groups (10 provinces x 2 sexes x 7 age groups) the person weights of records in a given PSA group were adjusted by multiplying by the following ratio:

$$\frac{\text{projected census population count for PSA group}}{\text{sum of person weights of NADS records in PSA group}}$$

It should be noted that persons living in households without telephone service are included in these Census projections and are therefore reflected in the weights even though such persons were not sampled.

### 8.3 Types of Estimates

Two types of "simple" estimates can be tabulated from NADS data: qualitative estimates (counts or proportions of people possessing certain characteristics) and quantitative estimates (quantities or averages)

#### 8.3.1 Qualitative Estimates

Qualitative estimates are estimates of the number of people or proportion in the target population possessing certain characteristics. For example, the number of people in Saskatchewan who have used marijuana in the past 12 months is a qualitative estimate. Such estimates are readily obtained by summing the final weights of records possessing the characteristic in question.

#### 8.3.2 Quantitative Estimates

Quantitative estimates are estimates of quantities or averages. For example, the number of drinks in the past seven days, weight, and age are all quantitative estimates. Averages can be calculated in the form of a ratio ( $X/Y$ , where X is a quantitative estimate and Y is a qualitative estimate). For example, the average number of drinks in the past 7 days of men aged 15-19: the numerator X = total number of drinks in the past 7 days for men aged 15-19; the denominator Y = number of men aged 15-19. Quantitative estimates are calculated by multiplying the final weight by the value given for the variable of interest. For example, to calculate the total number of drinks in the past 7 days by men aged 15-19, you would multiply the number of drinks in the past 7 days by the final weight for each male 15-19 in the survey; these amounts would then be summed to get the estimate of total drinks. To calculate the average number of drinks in the past 7 days by men 15-19, two steps are needed: first the total number of drinks must be calculated as just described; then the final weights of men 15-19 are summed to give an estimate of the number of men 15-19; finally the average is calculated by dividing the total number of drinks by the number of men 15-19.

### 8.4 Guidelines for Analysis

The respondents from the NADS do not form a simple random sample of the target population. Instead, the survey had a complex design, with stratification, multiple stages of selection, and unequal probabilities of selection of respondents. Using data from such complex surveys presents problems to analysts because the survey design and the selection probabilities affect the estimation and variance calculation procedures that should be used.

The NADS used a stratified design, with significant differences in sampling fractions between strata. Thus some areas are over-represented in the sample (relative to their populations) while some other areas are relatively under-represented; this means that the unweighted sample is not representative of the target population. The survey weights must be used when producing estimates or performing analyses in order to account

for this over- and under-representation. While many analysis procedures found in statistical packages allow weights to be used, the meaning or definition of the weight in these procedures differ from that which is appropriate in a sample survey framework, with the result that while in many cases the estimates produced by the packages are correct, the variances that are calculated are almost meaningless.

For many analysis techniques (for example linear regression, logistic regression, estimation of rates and proportions and analysis of variance) a method exists which can make the variances calculated by the standard packages more meaningful. If the weights on the data are rescaled so that the average weight is one (1), then the variances produced by the standard packages will be more reasonable; they still will not take into account sample's design, but they will take into account the unequal probabilities of selection. The rescaling can be accomplished by dividing each weight by the overall average weight before the analysis is conducted. Note that this rescaling is done only for the purpose of calculating variances, not for the production of estimates.

The calculation of truly meaningful variance estimates requires detailed knowledge of the design of the survey; such detail cannot be given in this microdata file because of confidentiality. Variances that take into account the sample design can be calculated for many statistics by Statistics Canada on a cost recovery basis.

#### 9. DATA ANALYSIS AND RELEASE

The estimates derived from this survey were based on a sample of households. Somewhat different figures might have been obtained if a census of the total population had been taken using the same questionnaire, interviewers, supervisors, processing methods, etc. as those used in the sample survey. The difference between the estimates obtained from the sample and the results from a complete count taken under similar conditions is called the "sampling error of the estimate".

Although the exact sampling error of the estimate, as defined above, cannot be measured from sample results alone (otherwise a survey would be unnecessary), it is possible to estimate a statistical measure of sampling error from the sample data: the standard error. Using the standard error, confidence intervals for estimates (ignoring the effects of non-sampling error) may be obtained under the assumption that the estimates are normally distributed about the true population value. The chances are about 68 out of 100 that the difference between a sample estimate and the true population value would be less than one standard error, about 95 out of 100 that the difference would be less than two standard errors, and it is virtually certain that the differences would be less than three standard errors.

Because of the large variety of estimates that can be produced from a survey, the standard error is usually expressed relative to the estimate to which it pertains. The resulting measure, known as the "coefficient of variation of an estimate" (CV) is obtained by dividing the standard error of the estimate by the estimate itself. It is expressed as a percentage of the estimate.

Data to be published should be reviewed for release according to the following criteria:

- unqualified - CV not larger than 16.5%;
- qualified - CV between 16.6% and 33.3% (marked \* high sampling variability); and
- suppressed - CV greater than 33.3% (marked - not releasable).

## 9.1 Rounding

In order that estimates produced from the National Alcohol and Drug Survey microdata file correspond to those produced by Statistics Canada, users are urged to adhere to the following guidelines regarding the rounding of such estimates. It is unwise to release unrounded estimates, as they imply greater precision than actually exists.

### 9.1.1 Rounding Guidelines

- (1) Estimates of totals in the main body of a statistical table should be rounded to the nearest thousand using the normal rounding technique (see definition in section 9.1.2).
- (2) Marginal sub-totals and totals in statistical tables are to be derived from their corresponding unrounded components and then are to be rounded themselves to the nearest thousand units using normal rounding.
- (3) Averages, proportions, rates and percentages are to be computed from unrounded components and then are to be rounded themselves to one decimal using normal rounding.
- (4) Sums and differences of aggregates and ratios are to be derived from corresponding unrounded components and then rounded to the nearest thousand units or the nearest one decimal using normal rounding.
- (5) In instances in which, due to technical or other limitations, a different rounding technique is used, which results in estimates being released which differ from the corresponding estimates produced by Statistics Canada, users are encouraged to note the reason for such differences in the released document.

### 9.1.2 Normal Rounding

In normal rounding, if the first or only digit to be dropped is 0 to 4, the last digit to be retained is not changed. If the first or only digit to be dropped is 5 to 9, the last digit to be retained is raised by one. For example, the number 8499 rounded to thousands would be 8 and the number 8500 rounded to thousands would be 9.

## APPROXIMATE SAMPLING VARIABILITY TABLES

Sampling variability guidelines for the release of estimates

Users should determine the number of respondents on the micro data file who contributes to the calculation of the estimate. If this number is less than 30, the weighted estimate should not be released regardless of the value of the coefficient of variation for this estimate.

Type of Estimate	Coefficient of Variation (in %)	Policy Statement
1. Unqualified	0.0 to 16.5	Estimates can be considered for general unrestricted release. No special notation is required.
2. Qualified	16.6 to 25.0	Estimates can be considered for general unrestricted release but should be accompanied by a warning cautioning users of the high sampling variability associated with the estimates. Such estimates should be identified by the letter Q (or in some other similar fashion).
3. Restricted	25.1 to 33.3%	Estimates can be considered for general unrestricted release only when sampling variabilities are obtained using an exact variance calculation procedure. Otherwise, the estimate should be deleted. When sampling variabilities are obtained using exact variance calculation procedures, the estimates should be accompanied by a warning of high sampling variability associated with the estimates.
4. Not for Release	33.4% or over	Estimates should not be released in any form under any circumstances. In such statistical tables, such estimates should be deleted.

Note: The sampling variability policy should be applied to rounded estimates.

Derivation of sampling variabilities for each of the estimates which could be generated from the survey would be an extremely costly procedure, and for most users, an unnecessary one. Consequently, approximate measures of sampling variability in the form of tables have been developed for use.

There are individual tables for each of the provinces and regions. It should be noted that all coefficient of variation in these tables are approximate and, therefore unofficial. Estimates of actual variance for specific variables may be obtained from Statistics Canada on a cost-recovery basis. Use of actual variance estimates may allow users to release otherwise unreleasable estimates, i.e. estimates with coefficient of variation in the "restricted" range (see the policy regarding the release of the survey estimates on page 1).

The coefficients of variation were derived using the variance formula for simple random sampling and incorporating a factor to reflect the multi-stage clustered nature of the sample design. This factor is known as the design effect and is defined as the ratio of the variance of an estimate from the LFS to the variance from a simple random sample of the same size. The design effect has been determined by first calculating design effects for a wide range of characteristics and then choosing among these a conservative value which will not give a false impression of high precision.

The following rules should enable the user to determine the approximate coefficients of variation from the Sampling Variability Tables for estimates of the number, proportion or percentage of the surveyed population possessing a certain characteristic and for ratios and differences between estimates.

Rule 1: Estimates of Numbers possessing a Characteristic (Aggregates)

The coefficient of variation depends only on the size of the estimated aggregate itself. On the Sampling Variability Table for the appropriate geographical area, locate the estimated aggregate in the left-most column of the table (headed "Numerator of Percentage") and follow the asterisks across to the first figure encountered. This figure is the estimated coefficient of variation.

Rule 2: Estimates of Percentages or Proportions possessing a Characteristic

The coefficient of variation of an estimated percentage or proportion depends on both the size of the percentage or proportion and the size of the total upon which the percentage is based. Estimated percentages or proportions are relatively more reliable than the corresponding estimates of the numerators of the percentages, particularly

if the percentages are 50 percent or more. (Note that in the tables the cv's decline in value reading from left to right).

When the percentage or proportion is based upon the total population of the geographic area covered by the table, the cv of the percentage or proportion is the same as the cv of the numerator of the percentage. In this case, Rule 1 can be used.

When the percentage or proportion is based upon a subset of the total population (e.g. those in a particular age-sex group), reference should be made to the percentage (across the top of the table) and to the numerator of the percentage or proportion (down the left side of the table). The intersection of the appropriate row and column gives the coefficient of variation.

### Rule 3: Ratios

In the case where the numerator is a subset of the denominator, the ratio should be converted to a percentage and Rule 2 applied. This would apply, for example, to the case where the denominator is the number of males and the numerator is the number of male who hunted Waterfowls.

In the case where the numerator is not a subset of the denominator, the coefficient of variation of the ratio of two estimates is approximately equal to the square root of the sum of squares of each coefficient of variation considered separately. That is, the coefficient of variation of a ratio:

$$R = \frac{X}{Y}$$

$$\text{is } Sd(R) = R (\text{cv}(X)^2 + \text{cv}(Y)^2)^{1/2}$$

The coefficient of variation of R is approximately

$$\text{cv}(R) = \frac{\text{sd}(R)}{R}$$

This formula will tend to overstate the error if X and Y are positively correlated and underestimate the error if X and Y are negatively correlated.

Rule 4: Differences between totals or percentages

The standard deviation of a difference between two estimates is approximately equal to the square root of the sum of squares of each standard deviation considered separately. That is, the standard deviation of a difference:

$$d = X - Y$$

$$\text{is } sd(d) = (x^2 \text{ cv}(X)^2 + Y^2 \text{ cv}(Y)^2)^{1/2}$$

The coefficient of variation of d is approximately:

$$cv(d) = \frac{sd(d)}{d}$$

This formula is accurate for the difference between separate and uncorrelated characteristics but is only approximate otherwise.

Rule 5: Difference of Ratios

In this case, Rules 3 and 4 are combined. The cv's the two ratios are first determined using Rule 3, and the cv of their difference is found using Rule 4.
