

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### HOW TO READ THIS DOCUMENT

The survey instruments document is a summary of the questionnaire administered to respondents. This document contains the actual question text, standard instructions provided to interviewers, flow patterns and identifies who is eligible to receive each module of the questionnaire. **Bold** text is read, as worded, by the interviewer. Instructions for interviewers are preceded by the word « <a href="INTERVIEWER">INTERVIEWER</a> » and are not read out loud to the respondent. To facilitate interpretation of this document the following points should be noted:

**Question Numbers:** The question numbers used throughout the survey instruments refer to the actual numbers used in the software and which appear on an interviewer's computer screen. In the codebook, released in conjunction with the data set, this variable name appears as the « collection name ».

Standardized codes are used to identify the function of each question. The first few letters indicate the module, for example **EDU\_Q**06 identifies this as a question from the Child Education module. The letter immediately following the underscore indicates the action to be undertaken by the application. Refer to the chart below for frequently used codes.

**Pre-fill items:** These items are preceded by ^ and are specific to the respondent's interview. The software adds the relevant information into the question, making it simply a matter of the interviewer reading the text displayed on the screen. The majority of these fills are used to change verb tenses such as is/was. Some of the fills were used to personalize the interview for the gender of the respondent, but for the sake of clarity only the masculine gender has been used in the codebook. Some examples of less typical pre-fill items are:

AINFO.FNAME – This is the first name of the respondent to whom the question refers. This is not necessarily the person who is talking to the interviewer.

^LastIntMonthE – This refers to the month that the respondent was last interviewed.

^LastIntYear – This refers to the year that the respondent was last interviewed.

^PHRASE (F) – Text is inserted that is dependent on specific conditions e.g. text could vary depending on the age of the respondent.

^BefOct16 – This adds text to the question if the interview data is prior to October 16th of the reference year.

**Ranges:** Hard and soft ranges are specified for some of the questions. The hard range gives the highest and lowest acceptable response values. For example, in ACTC Q9 (How many hours a

day the youth spends on a computer) a hard range of 0.0 - 16.0 exists. If the interviewer tries to enter a number greater than 16.0, the system will not accept this.

The soft range specifies an upper limit which, if exceeded, will result in an edit (ACTC\_E9) to prompt the interviewer to confirm that the amount entered is correct. If it is correct, the interviewer can enter it as long as it does not exceed the hard range. For example, if the respondent provides a response of 15 hours which exceeds the soft range of 9.0 hours, but then confirms that their response is correct, the interviewer could enter the answer since it does not exceed the hard range of 16.0 hours provided for that question.

Dates: All dates are in DD/MM/YYYY format unless otherwise specified.

**Universe:** At the end of each question a universe statement is provided to indicate which respondents were asked that particular question.

Apart from these general instructions, there are also variables that are created by the application and stored for use throughout the interview. Generally, these variables are defined at the beginning of the module in which they are used. For example, in the INC module, the variable SPOUSEPRESENT is used in check item INC\_C1C1. This variable has a value of 1 when the respondent has a spouse living in the household and a value of 2 when there is no spouse.

### INTRODUCTION

The National Longitudinal Survey of Children and Youth (NLSCY) instruments – by which we mean the various questionnaires used to gather information from parents, children and youth – can be divided into 3 groups:

- A- **Electronic questionnaires** loaded on the interviewers' laptops and administered by interviewers to parents and youth using computer-assisted (CAPI or CATI) methods:
  - Household contact information
  - Parent questionnaire
  - Child questionnaire
  - Youth questionnaire
- B- Paper questionnaires, self administered:
  - Booklet 20 self complete for 10- and 11-year-olds
  - Booklet 21 self complete for 12- and 13-year-olds
  - Booklet 22 self complete for 14- and 15-year-olds
  - Booklet 23 self complete for 16- and 17-year-olds
- C- **Other Instruments** to be administered by interviewers:
  - Peabody Picture Vocabulary Test Revised (PPVT-R) (Direct Measure, 4- and 5-year-olds)
  - Who Am I? (Direct Measure, 4- and 5-year-olds)
  - Number Knowledge (Direct Measure, 4- and 5-year-olds)
  - Math tests (Direct Measure, Grades 4 to 10)
  - Problem Solving Exercise (Direct Measure, 16- and 17-year-olds)

For Cycle 6, there are two published documents containing survey instruments: Book 1 contains the electronic questionnaires and Book 2 contains the self-administered paper questionnaires listed in B above. The instruments listed in C above will not be published. Several of them are available from publishers. Please see list at the end of this section.

This is **Book 1**. It includes the questions answered by the parent and youth. Information was collected from the parents about the children and from older youth themselves in telephone and/or personal interviews conducted by an interviewer using a computer. This document contains the computerized questionnaires, converted to readable format.

In the interests of simplicity and saving paper, where a series of questions has the same set of responses, only the first set is listed. For almost every question, DON'T KNOW and REFUSAL are possible answers, even if not shown here. The rules for skips for DON'T KNOW's and REFUSAL's are indicated by a flow information line. The flow remains the same for a same set even if not shown.

Different questions are asked about children depending on their age or whether they were respondents in previous cycles. We have tried to make it clear which questions are asked in which circumstances.

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

Note: An institutionalized child is considered as a household member. We do not send child to the tracing info (TRA\_Q01 Etc). The interviewer just writes the new address and phone number in the notes for children aged 10 to 17(except for those who reside in psychiatric institutions). The interviewer will decide if the self-complete will be administered to the child in the institution. For the children in psychiatric institutions (no matter which age) as well as the 0- to 9- year-olds (no matter which institution), we do not need the address and phone number (of the institution) since the parents will

complete the questionnaires for them It's not likely that many interviewers will actually be able to collect data from children in institutions, (e.g. interviewing a child in the Young Offenders Facilities) It is to the interviewer discretion to try to collect the information. If the information is not available, the interviewer will code it as partially completed and the case won't go to tracing.


