Fixed wireless or Point-to-Point connection:

Often found in rural areas, this form of wireless access works by sending an Internet signal from a central distribution tower to a receiver, often located on the roof of a dwelling. Homes receiving the signal must have clear 'line-of-sight' reception from the transmission tower (a path unobstructed by hills, large trees, etc.).

Many homes have high speed cable or telephone connections to their home, and use a wireless router to distribute the Internet signal to multiple devices in the home (such as laptops or other desktop computers). Wireless routers should not be recorded as a connection type, they are simply a device used to distribute the Internet signal within a home.
