#### **PREFACE**

This "Compendium of Integrated and Multi-disciplinary Justice Initiatives" represents a consolidation of two previous similar undertakings: the Canadian Centre for Justice Statistics (CCJS) compiled an inventory of "integrated" justice initiatives in August of 1996 and the Department of Justice Canada, under the direction of a Deputy Minister Work Group, was in the process of developing an inventory of "multi-disciplinary" justice initiatives. In November 1996, the Deputy Ministers responsible for the administration of Justice in Canada recommended that these two projects be brought together and that the information provided on each initiative be reduced in order to provide only a "thumbnail" overview. This report attempts to respond to these recommendations as well as a call for more up-to-date information. The CCJS undertook to develop and produce this report with information received from National Justice Statistics Initiative partners through to February 20<sup>th</sup> 1997. As with most inventories, this endeavour must be viewed as a "work-in-progress" due to the dynamic nature of the information provided.

#### Introduction

In recent years, there have been many justice initiatives undertaken in Canada which have been designed to improve the way justice services and programs are being delivered to the public. Many of these projects have adopted an integrated or multi-disciplinary approach in confronting similar jurisdictional issues.

Integrated Justice Approach: Within the justice system, a project/initiative may involve cross-sectoral partnerships and collaboration in working together on the delivery of services to the public (e.g., case management, crime prevention, victim services, information systems, family violence, child abuse, and treatment of youth, etc.).

Multi-disciplinary Approach: In addition to being cross-sectoral in nature, many projects or initiatives have taken a broader approach involving agencies traditionally considered outside the justice realm (e.g., health, social services, consumer and corporate affairs, the community and advocate groups, etc.).

These broad-based approaches to the administration and delivery of justice programs and services can offer tremendous potential for the government and public by providing more effective and efficient operations, as well as better information to support management decision-making, policy development and evaluation. Collaboration and co-ordination of efforts as well as the sharing of information among the justice partners in Canada are particularly critical in these times of fiscal restraint. This "compendium" was developed to improve information-sharing and, in particular, attempts to respond to the recognized need to know about the existence of integrated or multi-disciplinary initiatives in other jurisdictions. All partners in the National Justice Statistics Initiative submitted their contributions to the Canadian Centre for Justice Statistics (CCJS) for compilation and inclusion in this "compendium".

In total, descriptions of more than one hundred justice initiatives from across Canada were received by the CCJS and each is presented according to a standard template format in the attached inventory. In responding to this survey, many jurisdictions contributed additional background information and documents further describing their initiatives in more detail. Copies of these documents are available on request from the contact person identified for each jurisdiction or from the CCJS. In addition, an electronic version of this "compendium", which supports keyword searching of the information base, is also available on request from the CCJS.

Due to the short timeframe and the large volume of information provided, this report should be viewed as preliminary. The initiative descriptions have been organized by jurisdiction, from east to west across Canada. It should also be noted that there are some gaps and inconsistencies in the level and nature of information that has been provided across jurisdictions. However, the objective of this report is not to provide a comprehensive summary of justice initiatives, but rather to provide a model for discussion, future development and regular up-dating, access and dissemination. To this end, it is

intended that future editions of this report will be made available in electronic format only and the use of the Internet is being explored for this purpose.

The CCJS would like to acknowledge and thank the valuable and timely contributions all the partners in the National Justice Statistics Initiative in making this report possible. As well, the CCJS also looks forward to providing further assistance in refining this inventory of important projects.

4. Initiative Description:

In 1984, nine agencies within the jurisdictional boundaries of the RNC negotiated and signed a MOU for the care, detention, and treatment of intoxicated young persons. The MOU partners include: the RNC; Mental Health Services; Youth Corrections; Child Welfare; Drug Dependency Services; the Janeway Child Health Centre; Talbot House; St. Clare's Mercy Hospital; and, the General Hospital. The purpose of this agreement is to clarify that youths in a serious intoxicated state are in need of noncriminal intervention (except where an offence allegation is involved) and to specify the role and responsibility of each agency in this intervention. This agreement has stood with minor modification since the date of inception and is presently being reviewed due to structural change (i.e., the creation of Health Care Corporations, split jurisdiction for young offender services.
